

RFACA LEARN TO FLY SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Information on how to enter and prizes form part of these conditions of entry.
2. The Scholarship Competition commences on 1ST October 2012 and will be limited to 5000 Entrants.
3. To qualify for one of the two prizes of \$7700 each (including GST) worth of flying, entrants must:
 - (i) Be at least 16 years of age on 17/04/2012
 - (ii) Give an undertaking that they have had no formal flying training prior to taking the Introductory Flight.
 - (iii) Be able to meet Private Pilot Licence Medical Standards.

If a winner does not meet the above criteria the prize will be redrawn at same location as original draw on 02/04/2013 at 1.00pm.

The winner of the redraw will be notified in writing no later than 30/4/2013 and the result will be published in "The Australian" newspaper on that date .

(NOTE: The Introductory Flight may be taken by a person not wishing to enter the Scholarship Competition, in which case the above criteria does not apply.)

4. The closing date of competition is the 28/02/2013 and the Introductory Flight must be taken by this date.
5. The Introductory Flight and the two prizes of \$7700 worth of flying must both be flown at the same RFACA Flying Training Organisation and together with a Private Pilot Licence Test be completed by 18/03/2014
6. Employees of Airservices Australia, RFACA and its Member Clubs and Flying Schools, RFACA Executive, Technical Advisory & Safety Committee and their immediate families are not eligible for the Competition but may take the Introductory Flight.
7. Entrants will be assessed on their suitability for formal flying training and the top 10% from each participating RFACA organisation will be included in the draw for the prizes. This will be conducted in ACT on 11/03/2013 at 12.00pm
8. The winners of the Scholarship Competition will be notified in writing no later than 18/03/2013 and the result will be published in "The Australian" newspaper on that date
9. Should the Winners have commenced Flying Training at an RFACA Organisation after completion of the Introductory Flight, any fees paid for such training up to a sum of \$7700 will be refunded.
10. The \$7700 worth of flying is not transferable unless agreed to in writing by the executive of the RFACA and is not redeemable except as in Para.8 above. The flying fees accrued by the Winners up to the sum of \$7700 will be paid on a monthly basis to the RFACA Organisation at which the flying is carried out.

The RFACA and its employees, its members and their employees, Airservices Australia and its employees accept no responsibility or liability for any act or incident that occurs in connection with this competition which results from or is caused by any act or omission of the organisers or any other person.
